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## **1. About the Gajwel Town:**

The geographical, social, economical, educational and cultural background of the Gajwel division is mixed with both rural and urban environments. This town is located at 17.51 degrees north, 78.40 degrees east and it has an average elevation of 568 meters. According to the Indian census of 2011, it has a population of approximately 24,961. Male and Female ratio constitutes 50% each with an average literacy rate of 64.21%, (male 65.24% and female 48.64%) higher than the national average of 59.5%. Regarding to educational profile, Gajwel is the education hub in Siddipet district. There are 2 Government & 10 private degree & P.G. Colleges, 4 Government & 15 private junior colleges, 1 polytechnic, 1 B.Ed, 1 D.Ed, 1 Pharmacy colleges and 5 Government & 20+ private high schools. Further all of them together constitute about 30,000 students at age of between 15 to 25 years, for whom almost 1500+ teachers are rendering their selfless and dedicated service. Attractions and places to visit nearby Gajwel are Grate Medak Church, Kotilingaala Thoguta, Wargal Saraswathi Temple, Shivakeshava Alayam and Nacharam Temple. The beautiful lakes Pandavula Cheruvu, and add to the beauty of the place.

## **About the College:**

Government Degree College, Gajwel, Siddipet, (Dt) was established in the year 26-08-1997 with 00 students and now reached to about 00 students by the relentless efforts, role, participation and selfless support extended by then philanthropists, politicians, authorities. Being a prominent higher educational institution in the district with nearly six glorious decades of existence, College has been re-accredited with 'B' grade by NAAC in the year 2013. It has 15 Departments at UG and 3 at P.G. level with very spacious rooms and 00 well equipped laboratories. The college is endowed with many unique features. It is located in the renowned area of the town with 18.29 acres of land. It has 3 NSS units which are infusing national fervor and social awareness among their cadets. There are 70 well qualified and highly experienced lecturers who include as many as 15 doctorates and equal number of Ph.D pursuing staff. Further they always strive to put their best to impart application oriented education & values among the students, who hail from 100 economically, educationally and socially backward villages around Gajwel town.

As far as publication and research undertakings are concerned, college faculty has published 150+ Research Papers in ISSN & ISBN. They have attended more than 300 National Seminars and 24 International Seminars / Conference in which about 190+ papers were presented. 10 staff members were sanctioned with M.R.Ps and 25 were cleared their JRF (NET), UGC- NET/SLET/SET. The college has organized various National/State level Seminars and is dedicated to excellence in the field of higher learning. It is committed to the cause of empowerment and employability of its students with rich library and physical education facilities. Over the years of its long saga of success M.L.A.s and M.L.C.s are a few illustrious alumni of the college. The college time and again withstood the changes and proved its mettle by constantly encouraging talent and hard work. Sri. K. ## 2. About the Department:

### i. Origin & Establishment:

The **Department of Commerce** was established on the same day of establishment of this Government Degree College, Gajwel i.e., on 26.08.1997. Initially the department has offered B.Com Tax Procedures, with the permitted intake of 30 students but admitted were only 19 in which 9 were girls and 11 were boys. This course was the restructured in nature. During 1999-2000 Academic year another new course B.Com (Computer Applications) was introduced with the permitted intake of 30 students. In its evolution process, during the academic year 2009-10 B. Com Computers, during 2016-17 B. Com General Courses were introduced with 50 and 30 permitted intake respectively. Except B. Com General, remaining courses were with English as Medium of instruction. Further, keeping in the view of the demand for higher education needs of this region student, M.Com, Post- Graduation Course in Commerce was started during the 2015-16 Academic year with 40 sanctioned intake. Therefore, during these three decades of its selfless journey, department has developed in to leaps and bounds. Now the department is offering only B.Com Computer Applications in both media with the total sanctioned intake of 120 Students at U.G level and M. Com with 40 students at P.G. Level

As far as teaching and learning initiatives are concerned, The Department of commerce is endowed with highly qualified and experienced faculty members. They are always instrumental in inculcating and imparting quality and employable education, skills and competencies among commerce students. It is one of the vital & crucial departments of the college from the point of student's strength, academic results, organizing various co-curricular and extra-curricular activities. Guiding, supervising and mentoring students for their career growth & development and advancement in their future Endeavour are a few feathers in its cap right from its inception in 1997.

The department plays commendable and invincible role in producing prominent, esteemed and distinguished alumni. The students of the department have been excelled and explored themselves in different fields, events and activities and brought unprecedented glory and remarkable shine to the college in general and department at particular. Its faculty also closely associated and conducted with copious amount of scholastic works, which are indeed quite useful to its students and college in general. At present the department has 8 faculty members in which One is possessed Doctorate, and all the remaining faculty members are pursuing their research degree besides possessing UGC-Accredited NET/SLET/SET certificates. Right from commencement of the Commerce course in the College to till date 8 well experienced faculty members have discharged their flawless duties as HOD,s. At present **Dr. Gopala Sudarshanam** is discharging his responsibilities as Head of the Department. **iii. Medium of Instruction:**

As the department is offering three different U G Programs, Viz B. Com general Telugu medium, B.Com General English Medium and B. Com Computer Applications, medium of instruction is telugu for B. Com general Telugu medium and English for B.Com General English Medium and B. Com Computer Applications. P G Program, M.Com(Accounting).

**iv. Composition of the Faculty:**

Faculty of the Department at present comprises of 1 Regular, 2 Contract and 3 Guest. All of them have put in very appreciable amount of experience in teaching as well as in research. The regular faculty were recruited and appointed as per the existing UGC norms. contract faculty were also recruited by the modalities designed by the State Government and will be paid with consolidated pay, whereas the guest faculty are engaged based on the surplus workload in the Department and remuneration will be paid as per

the state government instructions. i.e. at the rate Rs. 300=00 per period for not more than 72 periods per month. Dr Gopala Sudarshanam apart to discharging his responsibilities as Head Department of Commerce also holding the positions of Academic Coordinator, Convener for College Research Forum, Finance Committee Member and District Resource Center (DRC) Coordinator in the College.

#### **v. Socio-Economic Background of the Students:**

The majority of the Students admitted into various programs offered in the department are hailing from rural areas. Further most of them are first generation children for their respective families. when it is contemplated into their socio-economic background from the available records of the College it is found that more 24 percent of students belongs to Scheduled cast, 16 percent are of Scheduled Tribes, 51 percent are of various Backward castes and rest of the percentage i.e. 9 percent are of forward castes. Hence it will be conferred that the majority of the Students i.e. 91% admitted into our Commerce Stream belonging to SC, ST & BC communities. When an attempt is made to find the economic status of the students it was also found that about 38 percent of students' families are under BPL and working as daily koolies (Labour) and 46 percent families are agriculture dependents for their lively hood. Only meager amount of families i. e. 16% are backed by Government Employment, Business as profession and promotion of Self employment. Therefore very significant number of students of the department is major bread winners of their families. Hence they have been engaged in various kinds of part-time jobs and resulting for poor attendance in the class rooms.

#### **vi. Academic Results for last Five Years:**

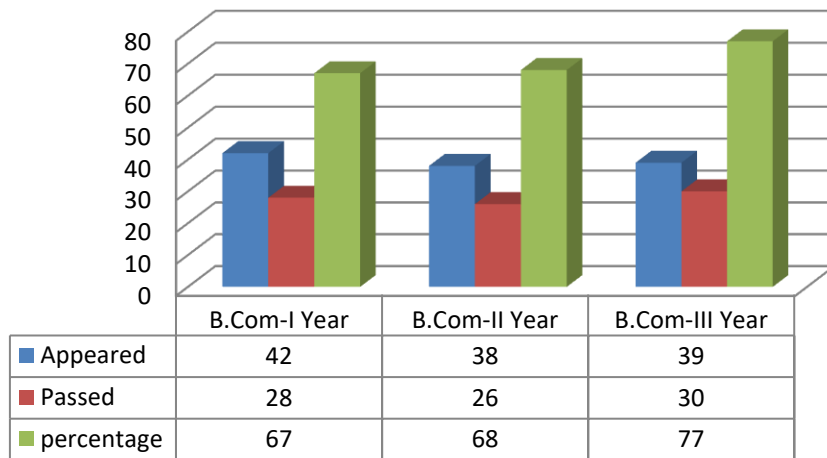

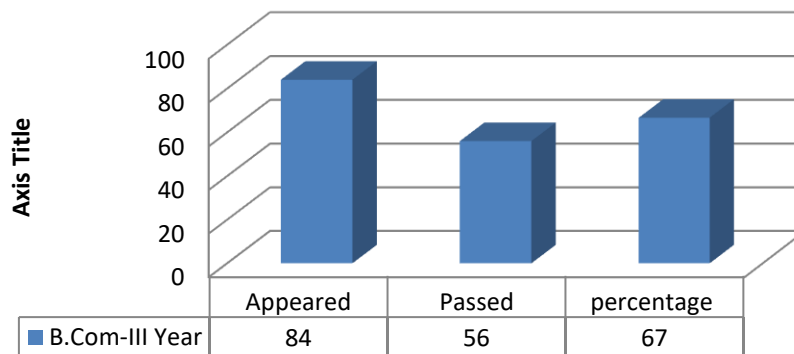
### Analysis for the Academic Year-2016-17 Semester I & II

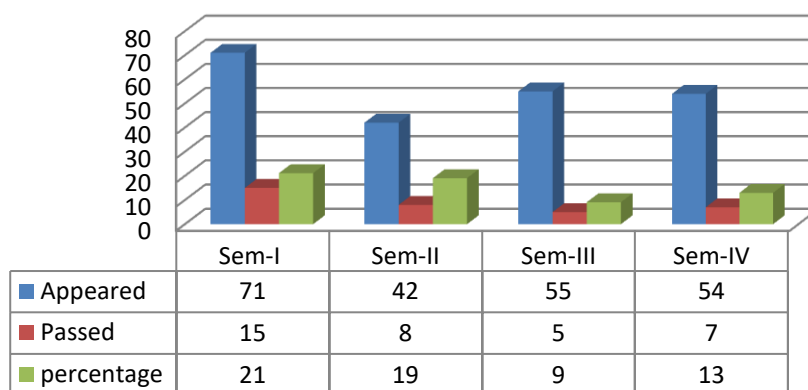

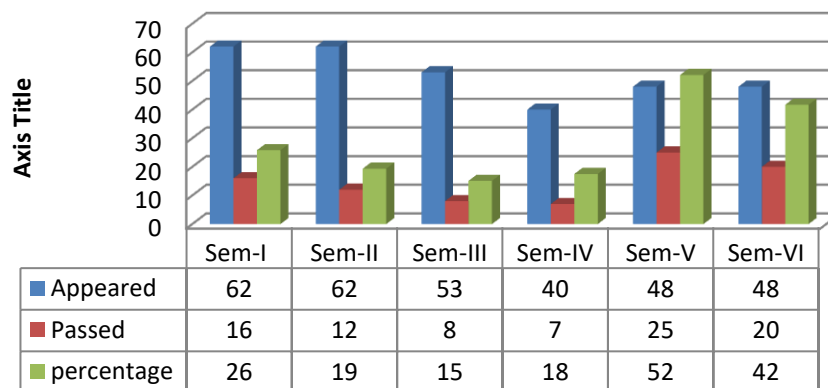

### Semester wise Results Analysis for the Academic Year-2017-18



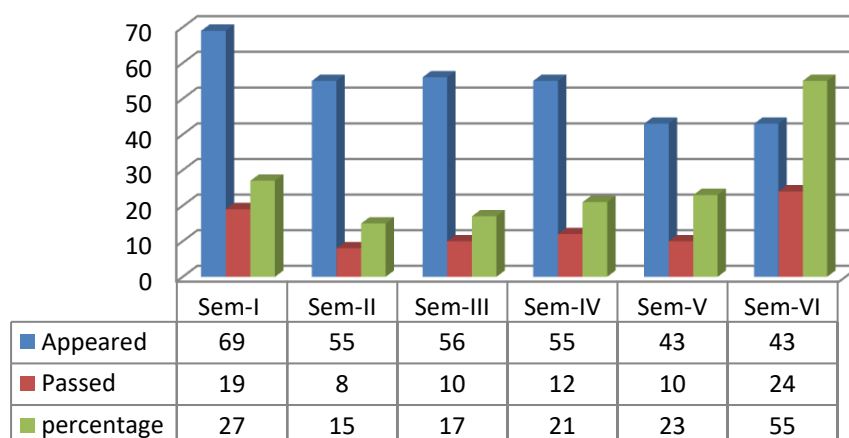

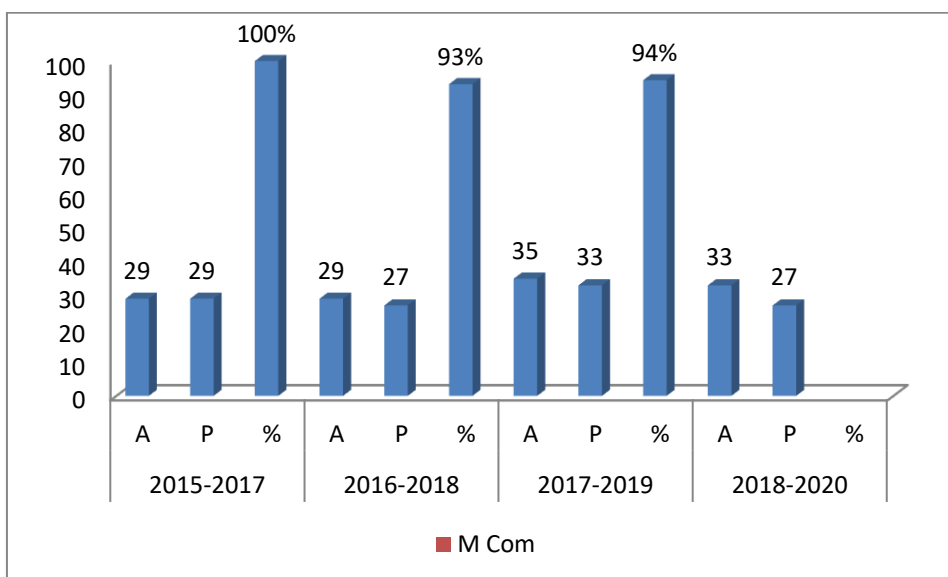

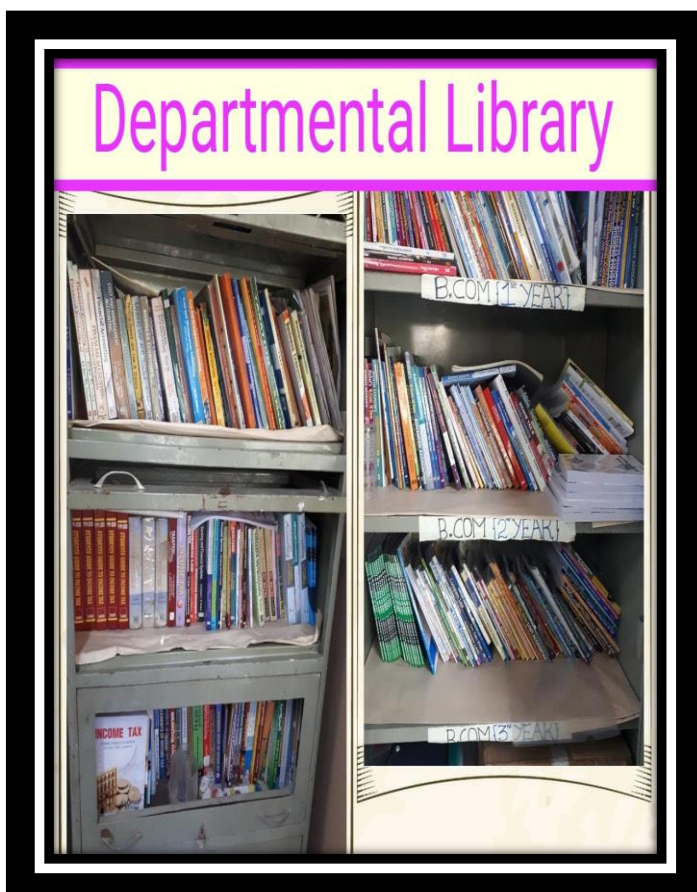
### **vii. Academic Records:**

## 4. Students Evaluation Pattern:

## **5. Composition of the Departmental Activities:**

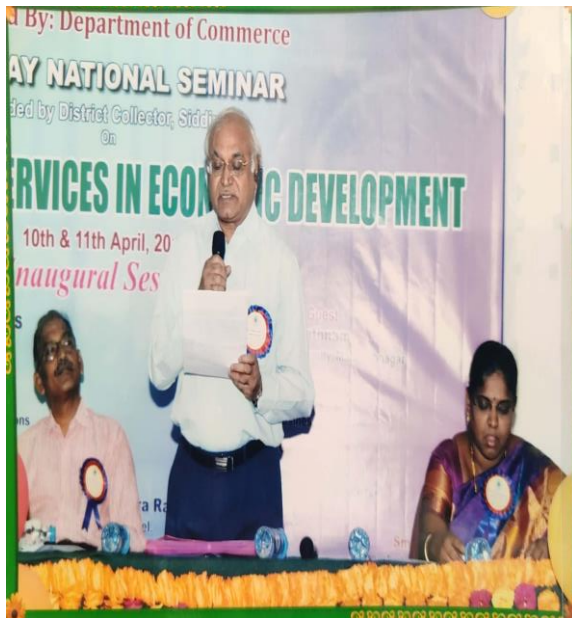










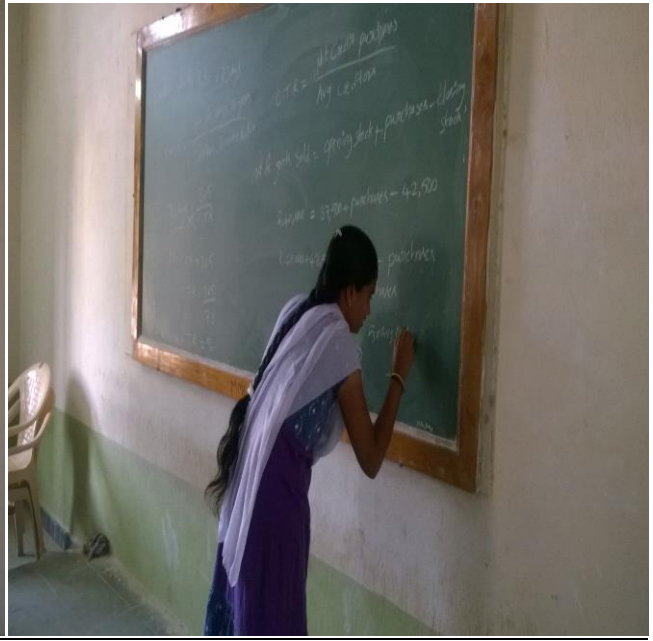
