1. EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

1.1 INTRODUCTION

Dr. BRR Govt. Degree College, Jadcherla, Mahabubnagar District, T.S. was established in the year 1963 by the Merchant's Association under private management. The college was taken over by the Government in the year 1970 and named after the first Chief Minister of Hyderabad State, Dr. Burgula Ramakrishna Rao as Dr.BRR Government Degree College.

The process of admissions is widely publicized through hand book, brochure and college web site. UG I Year admission procedure is carried out State wide by Online admission process through DOST (Degree Online Services, Telangana). The ICT technology is fully utilized in the Teaching – Learning process by individual teachers. Some Faculty members have completed MRPs with the UGC grants. Attending Orientation, Refresher programs, National Seminars / Workshops and FDPs have become a part and parcel of enhancement of teaching skills. During the COVID-19 Pandemic the college has offered Online Teaching by utilizing different platforms like ZOOM, YouTube, Microsoft Teams etc.,

The college has sufficient number of class rooms with furniture and spacious Seminar Hall to meet the needs of the students. It has 15.17 acres of campus area which fulfils the needs of extracurricular activities. The UGC has sanctioned a women's hostel which has been constructed and presently occupied by the girl students. It accommodates 100 students. The college library is a centre of excellence which fulfils the needs of the college students by providing them with books and reading room as well. The Department of Physical Education takes an active role by involving the students in various sports activities at college and university levels and by sending a few of them to state and national levels. The college accommodates Dr. B.R.Ambedkar Open University Study Centre to facilitate those seekers who cannot afford regular on- campus education.

Scholarships are being sanctioned to the economically and socially backward students. Career Guidance Cell, Grievances redressal Cell, Student Mentoring Cell, take active initiatives to support the needs of the students. TSKC also plays a vital role in molding the students to face the global challenges n the field of employability and life adoptability skills.

1.3 CRITERIA WISE SUMMARY

Curricular Aspects

The motto of our institution is to instruct and motivate the students to face unprecedented challenges in life. In academia it is noted that effective and strengthening curriculum design always proved to benefit students across all the sections of the society. Ours being an affiliated college, we implement the curriculum that is designed by Palamuru University, Mahabubnagar. However, a few of our lecturers are nominated by the affiliating university as to be the members of Board of Studies (BOS). They are empowered to suggest changes in curriculum in their respective subjects in annual BOS meetings. These suggestions are based on the formal feedback on curriculum that is collected from the students, parents, and other stakeholders. The institution has well-structured mechanism for the effective implementation of curriculum. The mechanism includes preparation of Annual Curricular Plans (ACP's) subject and paper wise for each semester, preparation of teaching plans, maintenance of teaching diary and for departmental review meetings. The methodology of implementation of curriculum comprises lecture method and student centric class room strategies supplemented by Information Technology (ICT) methods, like Power Point presentations, You Tube lessons, flow charts,

Audio Visual aids, virtual classrooms. In addition to these, online channels are enabled during the academic year 2020-21 such as ZOOM, GOOGLE MEET, YouTube Live etc., to moderate and compensate the loss of off-line classes. Technical platforms are effectively put to use, besides, co curricular activities like Quiz, class room seminars. Institution has encouraged students to reap the fruits of mutual learning by motivating them through peer learning strategies.

In the academic year 2019-20, new syllabus has been incorporated in existing syllabi of various subjects and the due course of action is planned accordingly so that the incorporation would yield maximum benefits to the student community through the mode of regular instruction. The relevant study materials in the form of textbooks and practical manuals have been made available to the student community of various streams.

Teaching-learning and Evaluation

The college has been catering to the needs of students with required knowledge and relevant skills to excel in life. The college promotes student-centric approach through participative learning, experiential learning, and collaborative learning by adopting teaching methods such as Group discussions, Quizzes, Class room seminars, Student assignments, Field surveys, Field trips; Invited Talks by experts etc., Teachers assess the learning levels of diverse students. Slow learners are identified and necessary remedial coaching is imparted to them. Challenging tasks like classroom seminar presentations, Assignments, Study projects etc., are assigned to the advanced learners to encourage further speedy learning. Students are sensitized on gender sensitive issues. Feedback on Teachers is taken every year to identify their strengths and teaching abilities. Students are encouraged to participate in seminars and workshops. The admission process is transparent through DOST (Degree Online Services Telangana)governed by the Higher Education Department of Telangana State, which gives access to all qualified 10+2 students for their enrolment in the college.

During the academic year 2020-21 both On-line and Physical instruction methods are adopted to cope with the COVID-19 Pandemic. Teachers use ICT tools to explain difficult concepts and to create interest in related topics. Field trips are organized for conceptual learning. Faculty is periodically trained in Orientation and Refresher Courses at reputed University HRDCs. There is a steady growth in the average percentage of results during the last five years.

Besides having well qualified and dedicated staff members to provide education, the institution has good infrastructural resources in the form of Class rooms, Laboratories, ICT enabled smart class rooms, Virtual class rooms, Library, Gymnasium, Seminar Hall, Open auditorium, Spacious college ground to an extent of 6 acres, Botanical garden and Arboretum. Total 1633 students enrolled for the current year (2021-22). Forty five faculty members as teaching staff including Principal, Twelve staff members as Non-teaching staff are working in the college. Among the teachers, 6 members are having PhD degree, 3 members are having M.Phil degree, and 21 members have qualified NET/SET/SLET.

The Mentor-Mentee system which is adopted brings in an intimate relationship and rapport between the teacher and the taught.

Research, Innovations and Extension

Dr.BRR Government Degree College, Jadcherla is committed to excellence in research and innovation. The research committee of this College serves as a link among investigators at the college. The Research cell is for

providing guidance and support to the researchers. The committee encourages faculty members to take part in seminars and workshops held at local, national, and international levels. The College has Biodiversity Research and Education Centre and Telangana State Herberium which contribute for research study. The Telangana State Herberium received International Recognition

Dr. B. Sadasivaiah, Assistant Professor of Botany has named and identified four new species from Telangana, completed two MRPs, and he is working on a major research project. G. Satyanarayana Goud, Assistant Professor of Chemistry completed one MRP. During the past 5 years, the college researchers have recieved funding for Research Projects worth 1.063669 crore rupees and various departments have hosted national Seminars, workshops and 14 webinars. The Research committee's efforts resulted in the publication of 8 books and 25 research papers that were published in the UGC care list and peer-reviewed journals.

During the last five years, faculty members actively participated in a variety of extension activities with the support of students in the neighborhood community which is linked to their subject areas to raise awareness of community-related issues. Dr. B. Sadasivaiah, Assistant Professor of Botany, and N. Subhashini, Assistant Professor of Telugu, each earned five awards in honor of their Extension services.

Four NSS units and one NCC unit, as well as the college's Eco Club, Red Ribbon Club, Bhagya committee, Women Empowerment cell, Youth Red Cross, and Consumer Club all actively participated in and carried out various Extension and Outreach initiatives with the help of students.NSS Volunteer G. Tirupati MPC III yr. and NSS Unit -II Program officer N. Subhashini have been represented from Telangana in the prestigious Republic Day Parade Camp-2019. NCC crop K. Yugandhar B.A. I Year participated in Independence Day Celebrations -2022 at New Delhi, which is a pride to Our College. The College has 21 Memorandums of Understandings with other organizations for staff and student exchange, and field trips.

Infrastructure and Learning Resources

The college is established in the year 1963 to cater the higher educational needs of the stakeholders of surrounding villages. The College campus spreads across 15.17 Acres of land for the purpose of promoting thick vegetation. Saplings of various verities are planted along the approaching road in a tripartite manner, inside the college building the greenery is well maintained with the help of creating landscape gardening. Botanical garden serves as jewel in the crown for the green landscape. The landscape garden is also present around the BR Rao statue. The college building is spacious and ventilated with good physical infrastructure for teaching and learning.

The College is fully furnished with good infrastructure facilities which facilitate the teaching learning process. All labs are equipped as per UGC norms. TSKC, ELL labs are also utilized for ICT enabled teaching learning and training in the syllabus and beyond.

Classrooms are speciously furnished with green boards' lights and fans. The college campus has separate waiting rooms for boys and girls and Public Addressing System was installed and made accessible to all departments.

Indoor stadium becomes a perfect place for all the indoor games catering to the tastes of the student community. The campus harbors a well equipped Gymnasium for physical fitness of the students. Yoga centre regularly organizes classes on Asana, Pranayama, Dhyana techniques. The Career Guidance Cell, Prof. K. Jaya Shankar Open Auditorium for Cultural Activities help overall development of the stakeholders.

Telangana Botanical Garden is an asset to our College (TBG) and is the first Botanical Garden in the World which is established in a state geographical shape. It also possesses Net house (1000sft) and water storage cum percolation Pit.

Our college has installed 30KV solar power grid as a part of green and clean energy initiative. Owning to the solar panel installation and has reduced the burden of electricity billing as the grid is directly connected to the power panels.

KCR ARBORATUM is established to maintain trees of Telangana and Eastern Ghats.

Telangana State Herbarium has 2500 sheets covering 1206 plant spices and received international recognition from New Yark Botanical Garden

Student Support and Progression

Dr. BRR Government Degree College is a student focused institution which has prioritised upon student experience and learning outcomes.

The institution provides support to the students through various activities and government schemes. 61% of the students received scholarships from the state government over the last five years.

The institution has active career guidance and the Telangana Skill and Knowledge Centre (TSKC) which mainly focus on students' progression and professional growth by organising placement drives, coaching for competitive examinations and coaching for Post Graduation entrance exams. It also has language labs and Yoga Centre for development of soft skill and life skills.

The institution has a transparent mechanism for the timely redressal of student grievances to provide stress free atmosphere for the effective teaching learning process. The well developed mentor-mentee system monitors the students constantly and provides both academic and personal counselling.

The institution organises various extracurricular, cultural and sports activities to promote holistic development of students. Our students participated in co-curricular and extracurricular competitions conducted at college, university, state and national levels. The students also involved in various extension activities conducted by NCC, NSS, Red Ribbon Club and Eco Club etc...

The institution has an active registered alumni association which is involved in various activities organised by the institution. They have been providing financial support for college infrastructure development.

Governance, Leadership and Management

Administration is concerned with the determination and implementation of policies, Co-Ordination of finance and other departments, setting up a structure under executive control.

For the smooth implementation of policies and activities, the college constitutes various committees such

As CPDC, IQAC, ICC, Grievance Redressal committee, Woman Empowerment Cell, Youth Red Cross, Red Ribbon Club. Teachers and Students will be part of the committees in implementing the vision and mission of the college. Regular meetings are being conducted by the committees under the chairman ship of the principal and suggestions of the committee members are taken into consideration for the effective working of constituted committees.

The college has been implementing e-governance through e-Office Via CAIMS, e-Pass, DOST, IFMS and 'on line' bills through district and treasury office. All the Government employees are provided with various welfare schemes such as TSGLI, Group Insurance, Medical Reimbursements, Maternity Leaves, Paternity Leaves, Educational Loans, Home Loans, Loan from GPF etc., Staff is provided with financial support to attend various Faculty Development Programs. The Performance of the Lecturers is analyzed according to the norms set by UGC and CAS is sanctioned by the Commissioner after the verification of CAS proposals by the Specified Committee.

The College regularly undergoes financial audit by the auditor appointed by CCE. The last financial audit was conducted in the year 2020-21. There is a practice of interim audit in the colleges i.e. at the time of retirement of the principal. The College received ISO certification twice for maintaining efficient standards in the college.

The Commissioner of Collegiate Education enabled E-net for access to online internet banking for the specified officials where maker of the transaction is the senior most Administrative Officer/Superintendent/ Senior Assistant/Junior Assistant available in the college and checker of transaction is the principal of the college.

IQAC plays a key role in maintaining the academic standards. Regular meetings are conducted under the chairmanship of principal and an action plan is formulated for the effective implementation of academic activities such as student seminars, extension activities and other co-curricular, extra-curricular activities.

Institutional Values and Best Practices

The institution seeks to transform student's social and environmental attitudes by bringing up awareness and helping them to understand their roles and responsibilities. Accordingly, various programs viz., Gender equity promotion programs like Women's Rights, Career Counseling, Health & Hygiene, Personality development, Legal Rights. As a part of creating environmental awareness in the students and staff, solid waste management, liquid waste management is practiced with due procedures. Further, to conserve water, the practice of rainwater harvesting has been initiated. Other green practices on campus include observance of plastic-free campus, reducing paper usage, developing landscaping, using public transport instead of personal transport, and plantation activity with the involvement of staff and students.

As part of alternate energy initiatives, 6 solar lights are installed; LED bulbs are used in the college to check the

power consumption. To alleviate burden on grid, power requirements are met with LED bulbs. Specific initiatives like road safety, Harithaharam, awareness on drug abuse, observing HIV-AIDS day have been taken up with due diligence.

National Unity Day (Rashtriya Ekta Diwas), Digital transactions programs etc., are organized as a contribution to the local communities from the college side. To foster moral, ethical, and spiritual values in the students, various national festivals, birth anniversaries of national leaders, social reformers, and eminent personalities are being celebrated in college campus. In order to foster national integration, the Independence Day, Republic Day, National Constitution Day, Consumers Day and National Voters Day are celebrated. National Science Day, National Mathematics Day etc. are being observed for inculcating the scientific tempo among the students.

For the promotion of universal values, the programs like International Yoga Day, International Women's Day, International Mother Tongue Day, and World Human Rights Day. International day against Drugs are observed. The institution maintains complete transparency in academic, administrative, financial, and auxiliary functions through well-established procedural practices.

Dr.BRR Government Degree College is affiliated to Palamuru University, Mahabubnagar and follows the Curriculum designed by the University. The motto of our institution is to instruct and motivate the students to get ready for facing unprecedented challenges in life. In academia, it is noted that effective and strengthened curriculum design has always proved to benefit students across all sections of the society.

The University prepares the yearly almanac and semester wise curriculum which contains the beginning and ending days of the instruction, duration of preparatory holidays, days of internal assessment, schedule for semester examinations and vacation period. Subsequently, the college prepares semester wise lesson plan, teaching plan and department wise time table which are implemented scrupulously and effectively. Coordinating with other departments, the group wise time tables are prepared separately adding the 'medium of instruction' with the room numbers to avoid the undesirable mess and clashes. At the beginning of the academic year, department wise Annual plan is prepared consisting of field works, seminars, workshops, guest lectures, add on courses, certificate courses etc..

Involving in discussions with peers, the students enjoy learning in pairs and in groups. The teacher felicitates their learning process by focusing on the slow learners' requirements. The remedial classes and due guidance is imparted to the slow learners through online, offline and by mobile mode. The implementation of the plan is regularly monitored by the principal and the in-charges of the respective departments and they make sure to follow the plan scrupulously. For promoting the process of self evaluation, the college conducts the internal audit and the teachers get the necessary feedback from the students periodically.

2.3 Teaching- Learning Process

2.3.1 Student centric methods, such as experiential learning, participative learning and problem solving methodologies are used for enhancing learning experiences using ICT tools

Response:

All the teachers make the classes more interactive and encourage innovative thoughts of learners. ICT enabled methodologies are adopted for better comprehension of the topic. The departments organize invited talks by experts in concerned subjects. The internal assessments are conducted as per the schedule given by affiliated university. Every student submits written assignments to the teachers. The teachers of this institution adopt student centric methods such as Interactive Method, Project Method, Demonstration Method, and Student Seminars, Self-Learning from Internet / YouTube and Preparing assignments on the topics suggested by the teachers. The conventional methods such as Chalk and Talk, Lecture Methods are also in practice. The doubts raised by the students are clarified immediately. These methods allow the students to express different views. Assigning a "Student Study Project" encourages the students to learn the knowledge by experience. In science laboratories, the students actively participate in conducting experiments, observing the models, specimens, slides, computer program compilations etc., and such methods make the students draw their independent and relevant conclusions. All the teachers make the Learning interactive with students by inspiring and motivating the participation of students in Group discussions, subject Quizzes and Classroom discussions on various topics. The departments organize Invited Talks, Guest Lecturers for expanding relations with contemporary professionals. ICT enabled teaching includes e-Class Rooms, Language Labs, Smart Class Rooms are in practice to orient the students towards advanced learning options. Experimental method or laboratory method in science subjects allows the students to verify the facts and laws of the subject and draw conclusions through direct experience. The learners are encouraged to participate in National seminars/Workshops/Webinars.

This institution has Chemistry, Physics, Botany, Zoology, Microbiology, Computer Science, Computer Applications Laboratories and English Language Lab. Student seminars are organized where the students

can take a concept of the subject and explain either by presenting a paper or a poster. Under COVID-19 Pandemic conditions, this institution has adopted online teaching by using Zoom and Google Meet and disbursing assignments handouts by using Google Forms and WhatsApp.

The teachers are efficiently using ICT enabled tools during the Teaching Learning process. Due to COVID-19 Pandemic during the academic year 2020-21, the students and the staff are completely contained to their homes. By the instructions of Higher authorities i.e., The Commissioner of Collegiate Education-Telangana Government, to keep in touch with the students, all the staff members have conducted Online classes by adopting online platforms such as ZOOM meeting, and Google Meet. Online Tests are conducted with the help of Google forms; departments in the college have organized Webinars. The teachers during the containment period have prepared e- Content in the subject concerned such as PPTs and Video lessons and uploaded in YouTube for better self-learning by the students. With this the teachers succeeded in reaching the unreached. Besides several constraints of Network availability the teachers and learners could make the Online teaching process fruitful.

2.5 Evaluation Process and Reforms

2.5.1 Mechanism of internal/ external assessment is transparent and the grievance redressal system is time- bound and efficient

Response:

This institution conducts internal examinations at the college level as per the Almanac of affiliated University i.e., Palamuru University, Mahabubnagar. Each semester has two Internal examinations with maximum marks of 20 for I, II Year courses, 15 marks for III Year courses and 10 marks for special subjects such as AECC, SEC, GE, etc., Evaluation of Internal Examination answer scripts is done by the concerned teachers and marks secured will be uploaded to the affiliated university via Palamuru University ERP. The teachers interact with concerned students and assess their progress. The teachers clear the doubts related to the concerned course. The Dates of the Examinations and other modalities are followed as per the affiliated University, with due information to the students by way of Notice on the College Notice Board. The teachers communicate syllabus for the Internal Assessments to the students through classroom interaction. The Examination branch circulates a Common Time Table to all the students well in advance. After the conduct of the Internal Assessments, the marks obtained by the students are submitted online to the office of the Controller of Examinations Palamuru University, Mahabubnagar, which will calculate the average of marks secured in two internal exams and reflect on the results of the subjects concerned. The College Level Examination Committee monitors the smooth conduction of exams as per a common Timetable. The students appear for Semester end examinations of affiliated university at the allotted center. This college follows the guidelines and rules issued by the affiliating university while conducting internal and external examinations. Teachers distribute the evaluated answer scripts to the students. If students come across any doubts, the faculty clarifies for their improvement in coming examinations. The final internal assessment marks are calculated on the basis of their performance in internal exams and the submitted assignment. Transparency is maintained and marks are recorded in subject wise Marks Registers. The faculty uploads assessment marks of all internal examinations in time to University through College Login. Any grievances related to University Examinations such as printing mistakes in Hall tickets, Wrong entry of Subjects in Hall tickets, questions from out of syllabus during exams are addressed to the Center Superintendent and the same is reported to the university immediately. Information received from University after resolving the grievances/correction in Hall tickets and question paper is intimated immediately to the students during the examination through the examination committee members. If a student has any grievances related to evaluation of university answer scripts, they can apply for challenge evaluation/scrutiny. University declared the result of challenge evaluation/scrutiny after completing the

process on the university website.

Dr.B.R.R.Government Degree College has created an Ecosystem for Research and Innovation by

- 1. Entrepreneurship Development Cell
- 2. Establishment of Biodiversity Research and Education Centre
- 3. Establishment of Telangana State Herbarium
- 4. Excellent Research Infrastructure
- 1. Entrepreneurship Development Cell: The Entrepreneurship Development Cell (EDC) was established in our college with the goal of giving students the skills and motivational inputs needed to grow into aspiring entrepreneurs. The main objective of the Entrepreneurship Development Cell (EDC) is to change students' attitudes and promote new concepts that can be turned into commoditized goods and services that society requires. EDC provides the required mentoring,

lecture, and workshop arrangements by experienced individuals in order to motivate our students to come up with novel ideas and become employment creators rather than job seekers. Appropriate mentoring will enable students to use their entrepreneurial skills in the commercial sphere.

2. Establishment of Biodiversity Research and Education Centre: The Research Centre was established under the supervision of the Department of Botany and Coordinated by Dr. B. Sadasivaiah, Assistant Professor of Botany. It is fully equipped for research in the fields of Plant Taxonomy, Animal Taxonomy, Ecology, and Biodiversity Conservation. In future, it will also extend its services to applied branches of life sciences and also work as an incubation centre.

Three Ph.D. students from The Madura College in Madurai and Osmania University in Hyderabad are currently working in this centre as part of an MOU and collaboration with the departments of the botany of the aforementioned colleges. Research students from Osmania University, Hyderabad; Forest College and Research Institute (FCRI), Mulugu; MVS Government Degree College (A), Mahabubnagar are consulting for research guidance.

The Urban Forest Block Study is ongoing in the centre with the financial support of the Environmental Protection Training and Research Institution (EPTRI), Hyderabad under the supervision of Dr B. Sadasivaiah, Assistant Professor of Botany. At the same time, Floristic studies on the Eastern Ghats, Amrabad Tiger Reserve, Telangana, and Andhra Pradesh are going on. Quantification of Plant Resources of Amrabad Tiger Reserve, Phonology of selected trees is the present work in the lab. Plant-Animal interaction study, Identification of Butterfly host plants in Telangana Botanical Garden is going on. Litter study is also one of the tasks in the lab.

- 3. Establishment of Telangana State Herbarium: A National level Herbarium was established in the college under the supervision of P. Srinivasulu, Head, of the Department of Botany on 1/11/2021 and Presently, it harbours a total of 2250 plant specimens of 1260 species, which belong to142 families. The Herbarium is helpful to know climate change during past time, helpful for molecular studies and useful in taxonomic studies of our college students and Plant researchers. Dr B. Sadasivaiah, Assistant Professor of Botany is the coordinator for the Telangana State Herbarium Centre. It has received international recognition from New York Botanical Garden with the acronym TBGH
- 4. Excellent research infrastructure: Basic infrastructure needed for the research is available in the labs of Botany, Zoology, Physics, Chemistry, and Microbiology.

These extension initiatives have a significant impact on the neighbourhood.

The college has four NSS units with a total of 100 members each, as well as NCC, Red Ribbon Club, YRC, Eco Club, Consumer Club, and Health Clubs, all of which have raised awareness campaigns to educate the community and students in social issues.

NSS Units frequently hold a seven-day residential camp in nearby adopted villages. In order to address various social issues, our NSS volunteers engage in a variety of activities, such as plantation, maintaining cleanliness, conservation of water, Promotion of environmental awareness, Awareness in using toilets, Literacy Promotion, Promoting snake conservation, and eradicating blind beliefs. Along with NSS and NCC, our College YRC, Red Ribbon Club and Health Club conducted awareness Rallies on AIDS/HIV, First aid, Swachh Bharat, Voter's Day, Drug abuse, Pulse Polio Campaign, Eye check-up, Dental Checkup, Blood donation camps in the College and nearby villages.

During the pandemic, there were several COVID-19 vaccination drives and doctor talks to raise awareness of the need for the vaccine among students, faculty, and others.

The Eco Club and Department of Botany organised many plantation programmes, distribution of Plants through "each one plant one programme," food festivals, rainwater harvesting, solid waste management, the preparation and distribution of paper bags, preparation of clay Ganesh idols, Awareness on hazards of Plastic, Organic Farming, Vruksha Raksha Bandhan, online quizzes on significant environmental days to cultivate and instil ecologically conscious citizens,

4.3 IT Infrastructure

4.3.1 Institution frequently updates its IT facilities and provides sufficient bandwidth for internet connection

Response:

Information Technology is extensively used in all aspects of the college. It plays a vital role for the admissions through DOST (Degree Online Services Telangana) to maintain transparency and accessibility. It governed by the Telangana State Council of Higher Education (TSCHE). Examination-related information is uploaded on the University website. IT skills are used to collect fee from the students through the mobile application **Q- fix**. Further, all the relevant information like notices and announcements are uploaded on the college website.

The staff pay bills are being managed, updated in the Integrated Financial Management and Information System (IFMIS) of Telangana from 2019 onwards. All the transactions pertaining to the salaries and other emoluments of the staff are maintained through the Portal of the State Treasury Department. The attendance of the students and faculty are being monitored through biometric devices of TSTS ABAS (Telangana State Technological Services Attendee Biometric Attendance System). Due to Covid-19 pandemic, it has been stopped. All the scholarships of the students are being processed by the e-PASS (Electronic Payment & Application System of Scholarships) under government of the Telangana portal.

The College Administration and Information Management System (CAIMS) portal maintained by the Commissioner of Collegiate Education is in use to record all the financial and academic activities of the college from 2020 onwards. A separate Student Result Management System is prepared at the college level to get the data of students at a single entry. All the staff is adapted to online mode teaching by using different applications like Zoom, You tube in teaching, learning process from April 2020 during the Covid-19 pandemic situations.

The Institution offers courses in computer sciences in B.Sc, B.Com & B.A programs. The institution has one computer lab, one TSKC (Telangana Skills & Knowledge Centre) lab and one ELL (English language Laboratory) lab. The internet connection is proved to all the departments and free Wi-Fi access given to all the students and faculty.

The college has been upgraded its IT facilities as per the needs and requirements for the programs for the last five years through procuring the IT infrastructure from time to time.

The classrooms are equipped with LCD Projectors, digital displays, tabs, white Boards to enrich the teaching-learning process. One virtual classroom was established in the college in 2019 to conduct interactive sessions with the other Government Colleges of Telangana. The college offers I.T Related Programmes like Dev C++, Java Software, Oracle 9 i, Oracle 10g, Photo shop viewer and MS-office.

The Bharathi Fibre and Jio Fibre leased line for both administrative and academic purposes and upgraded the internet connection from 50 Mbps with a Wi-Fi facility on the campus. In January 2021, the broadband services of this institution are again upgraded to fiber premium plan with 100 MBPS from Bharathi Fibre (FTTH) and LAN is installed in all the classrooms and departments for the uninterrupted quality of internet facility.

6.1 Institutional Vision and Leadership

6.1.1 The governance and leadership is in accordance with vision and mission of the institution and it is visible in various institutional practices such as decentralization and participation in the institutional governance

Response:

The vision of the institution is "To emerge as a potential for higher education providing good education to backward learners, particularly for first- generation rural students in its vicinity and imparting quality education, knowledge application, life skills focusing on ethical and moral values thereby transforming them as responsible Indian citizens". Following this vision, the institution is striving to increase the quality of higher education for the urban and rural young students empowering their technical competence and academic excellence. Providing teaching and learning aids, the students develop creativity, critical judgment and effective communication. In connection with the mission of the college, the leadership qualities are progressively developed in the minds of students by introducing special enhancement courses in the academic curriculum which promotes knowledge and employability skills. In addition to our regular curriculum, Add-on Courses, Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses and Certificate Courses are promoted to bring out the inbuilt quality of the students.

The governance of the institution of Higher Education is operated by decentralizing the system and participative decision- making. Accountability and transparency are scrupulously followed in admissions and accounts. The admissions are done by Degree Online Services Telangana (DOST) which was introduced by the government of Telangana in 2015. The principal, teaching faculty members and non-teaching staff collectively take the decisions and implement the same for the development of the college. Decisions and policies made by the Commissioner of Collegiate Education (CCE) Telangana state are implemented scrupulously. On emergency and important issues, the Head of the Institution personally calls for Council meets to take instant decisions. The decisions resolved in regular council meetings are timely put into operation.

At the beginning of every Academic year, the College conducts orientation and induction programs to transmit awareness among the students and prepare an 'Annual Institutional Plan' to carry out the college activities right through the year.

To strengthen the concept, certain responsibilities and activities are delegated to the Vice-Principal, In-Charges of the Departments, Co-ordinators, non-teaching staff and other members to bring out the quick ending.

Activities are embarked on by including all the Heads of the Departments, teaching and non-teaching staff. An open-door policy is adopted for teaching, non-teaching staff and students who can approach the principal at any time. In addition to that, the students are connected to all concerned faculty members who can easily reachable to the calls to clear their academic doubts. To improve accessibility and accountability among the students and faculty, class and batch wise what's app groups are formed. The procedure helps to communicate and send links of the video and audio prepared by faculty so that it becomes easy to execute teaching and learning course effectively.

All the faculty members are included in the committees formed by the college. The important decisions are subjected to approval by the constituted committee. Later, the convener of the committee and Head of the Department call for an internal meeting with the respective faculty and take the decisions on academic and financial matters.

The Head of the institution is the Principal of the college, assisted by the Vice-Principal. The college has 14 departments and each department is executed by the Head or in charge concerned.

Service Rules, Procedures and Recruitment:

The recruitment of all the staff is done through TSPSC, erstwhile APPSC and by promotion as per the eligibility criteria prescribed by G.O.Ms . No. 47 Higher Education (CE-I-1) Department Dated 14.05.2001.

The newly recruited lecturers are given induction training on academic, administrative and financial procedures. Orientation and Refresher programs for the staff members are conducted by CCE, Telangana State through UGC- HRDC of different universities. The administrative guidance is given by Regional Joint Director and Academic Guidance Officer from Commissionerate through circulars and mails. Service books are maintained as per the rules and relevant entries are made periodically and annually.

Promotion policy:

Faculty of UGC scale who complete requisite service and acquire additional qualifications, as per UGC norms and the GO issued by the state government, would be sanctioned higher scale with additional monetary benefits and change in taxonomy of their designation under the CAS. Senior faculty who complete 15 years of service with a PhD, would be promoted as Principal as per availability of vacancies. Regular Non-Teaching staff is promoted through AAS as per seniority.

Grievance Redressal Mechanism:

The Grievance Redressal Cell receives grievances from the students and documents them in order. Certain issues are solved by the committee at the spot and a few are forwarded to the principal. On advice of the principal, the committee personally counsels them and unravels the difficulty by inviting them to the cell.

6.3 Faculty Empowerment Strategies

6.3.1 The institution has effective welfare measures and Performance Appraisal System for teaching and non-teaching staff

Response:

Since the college is the government institution, the teaching and non-teaching staff who got appointed before 01/09/2004 under pension rules is sanctioned full pension after their superannuation. If the

employee expires, 50% of pension is sanctioned to the spouse. The employees appointed after 01/09/2004 are carried under Contributory Pension Scheme (CPS). As per the rules of the scheme, employees contribute 10% of the pay and DA and the government credits an equal amount into the account of the employees. At the time of the superannuation of the employee, 60% of CPS amount is sanctioned and 40% of the amount is kept in account to get the pension with the interest of the amount every month or get sanctioned full amount if employee is wished.

Group Insurance Scheme:

This is a compulsory scheme for all employees working in the government sector. Life Insurance Corporation offers this scheme for all employees. The insured amount is paid to the employee with interest either at the time of death or retirement whichever is earlier.

Employees Health Scheme: Since it is a state government scheme, the employees are treated free in Wellness centers or any registered private hospitals under Employees Health Scheme (EHS). The employees and pensioners along with their dependents are benefitted with this scheme.

General Provident Fund: The fund is the social security for the family of the employee. The employees subscribe the emolument to the GPF and Government sanctions the subscription amount along with the accumulated interest at the time of retirement or death of the employees. In case of emergency, loans are sanctioned and the partial amount is withdrawn from the accumulation amount. The Andhra Pradesh GPF Rules 1935 governed the procedures for provident fund was in force from 1.3.1963 to 31.8.2004.

As per the norms of the State Government and the UGC, the employees are granted different types of leaves such as earned leaves, medical leaves and extraordinary leaves etc., the leaves of 180 days for maternity and 90 days for child care are sanctioned for women faculty. Besides, 5 special leaves and one international women's day leave along with 15 casual leaves and 7 special casual leaves are sanctioned for women employees every year. In order to assist the spouse at the time of delivery, 15 days paternity leaves are sanctioned within 6 months of spouse delivery.

Career Advancement Schemes: The Institution follows the government stipulated norms for Career Advancement Schemes under which many staff moved to higher AGP's and even higher designations.

A performance appraisal system in the form of feedback is implemented as per the guidelines of UGC for

teaching staff. Performance appraisal of the staff is carried out regularly with the help of the Feed Back. The college administration obtains feedback on the performance of the staff from the stakeholders periodically. Student Feedback forms containing questions are used for the evaluation of faculty. The questionnaire helps the student to evaluate the faculty's teaching ability based on lectures, assignments and other activities undertaken.

6.4 Financial Management and Resource Mobilization

6.4.1 Institution has strategies for mobilization and optimal utilization of resources and funds from various sources (government/nongovernment organizations) and it conducts financial audits regularly (internal and external)

Response:

The Regional Joint Director of Collegiate Education, Hyderabad is the inspecting officer of the college. He audits the accounts of the Institution at the time of superannuation of the head of the institution. The Finance Committee verifies the state budget receipts and expenditure, receipts, self-finance accounts and stock of stationery of office and gives the report to the Principal. The scholarships committee of the college verifies the disbursement of SC/ST/BC Minorities scholarships. Proposals for prior permission from the Commissioner of Collegiate Education, Hyderabad are taken to utilize the amount from the accumulated special fee fund account.

The college collects a special fee from the students and it is the main financial source of the institution. All the expenses are met from the special fees. The government sanctions annual budgets under the heads of stationery, travelling etc. UGC also grants funds for the development of infrastructure facilities. Accounts Statements for the above are maintained properly.

All the Financial transactions are done online and it is by the principal only. These are supported by bills authorized by the principal and signed by concerned committees. High transparency is maintained in the allocation and usage of funds.

College undergoes Financial Audit every year conducted by Auditors appointed through CCE. And also interim audit is conducted at the time of retirement of the Principal. The external audit is done by Office of the Accountant General (AG). All the financial transactions done in his/her period are audited by an audit officer appointed by AG Office. The Commissioner of Collegiate Education conducts Academic Audit every year. The experts of this audit are authorized to look into the financial transactions of the college.

The external audit is again conducted by CCE, Telangana with the help of the State Audit Department, Telangana, Hyderabad. The Committee also does annual verification of department and their stock.

The Academic Audit team appointed by CCE conducts Academic and Administrative Audit (AAA). The

observations and suggestions are submitted to CCE in the form of an Action Taken Report.

External financial audits are also conducted by state-level AG and CCE regularly.

Every year, in February, all the staff submit their Income tax returns and it is verified by the Head of the Department of Commerce . Regular TDS of employee is done in the college and quarterly IT returns are submitted.

Internal Audit: The principal obtains the budgetary estimates for every financial year from the office. The salary budget requirement is prepared by the office and sent to CCE for the release of the quarterly budget. Staff Council meeting is conducted regularly for meeting the college development expenses from special fees and a resolution is passed to that extent signed by the Heads and the Principal.

Best Practice - I

1. Title of the Practice: Mentor Mentee System

2. Objectives:

- To Counsel, Guide, Motivate and Support the students in their development.
- To improve abilities and skills.
- Continuous monitoring to improve performance in exams and career.
- Identifying and resolving students' personal issues through counselling.
- To improve the educational and personal growth.

3. The context:

Observations of the mentors.

- Obtaining low grades.
- Finding failures in the exams.
- Not mingling freely with other students.
- Not paying attention in the class.
- Not participating in extracurricular activities.
- No knowledge to pursue higher education and employment.

4. The practice:

- The institute has a "Mentor Mentee" system. Under this initiative, one mentor is executed to monitor 30-40 students.
- The Mentor records the academic performance of the students and direct to the concerned subject teacher. The teacher finds weakness and encourages him to study well.
- The mentor monitors student's attendance and ensure him attends class regularly.

- Finding failures in exams, the mentor counsels to resolve both academic and personal issues.
- Finding interest in an extracurricular activity, the mentee is referred to the in charge.
- Identifying the slow earners, the mentor advises the concerned teacher to engage in remedial classes.
- Advanced students are encouraged to undertake project works, and enroll in competitive and PG entrance exam tutorials.
- The details are recorded in a "Counselling Register".
- Each mentor establishes a strong and caring bond with mentees.
- Effective communication with the students helps their respective mentors to understand their strengths and weaknesses. Hence, they can monitor them in the right direction. In some cases, counseling for time management, stress management, etc. is also provided to the students by their Mentor.

5. Evidence of Success:

This system led to improvements in the attendance of students and their performance in academics. The monitoring and the personal counseling help to train them to prepare for various state, central competitive and other PG entrance examinations. The personal intimacy with the mentees helps to improve their friendly nature. Students who were psychologically fragile are engaged in different academic activities. The problems faced by the students are discussed in the concerned meetings with respective mentors and they are addressed and solved by the mentors immediately.

6. Problems Encountered and Resources:

- To boost the efficiency of the "Mentor Mentee" system, necessary measures are taken to educate teachers and students.
- The mentors need to feel a sense of guardianship to express their feelings freely.
- The mentor finds sources for financial issues which help their academic activities.
- It is challenging to change a student's mindset so that their personality develops without impairing their academic performance.

7. Notes

The college has been following mentor-mentee system. It is found drastic changes in the academic style of the students. The individual counseling ensures the students foster holistic, psychological and physical development. The college results and PG seats in different universities of state and Central have progressively increased. Surprisingly, the students who finished the degree from college have been in touch with mentors for their career advice.

1. TITLE: TELANGANA BOTANICAL GARDEN

2. OBJECTIVES:

• To establish a unique Botanical Garden in the geographical shape of Telangana.

- To serve as a living repository for plants.
- To maintain plant collections for education, research, and conservation.
- To serve as a safe abode of the above endemic and threatened flora.
- To address the present and future needs for training, education and research.
- To serve as a seed bank of wild plants.

3. CONTEXT

"A **botanical garden** is dedicated to the collection, cultivation, preservation and display of a wide range of plants labeled with their specific names". These devote their resources to the study and conservation of plants and also play a central role in meeting human needs and providing well-being. In this mini review, a framework for the integrated missions of botanical gardens, including scientific research, in ex-situ conservation, plant resource utilization and citizen science are cataloged.

4. PRACTICE

Botanical Gardens are the source of knowledge for Biology students who are studying Botany as a career. In the syllabi, many plants were exemplified for the better understanding of the subject. In this context, it is decided to establish a Botanical Garden in the college premises rather than visiting other places for the study of different species.

Keeping in view the Botanical Garden was established in the college. Initially, it was started by the involvement of NSS volunteers in their leisure time within the area of 0.75 acres in 2019 with 7 sections. Within the span of one year, the garden has rapidly improved with 1000 individuals belonging to 170 species. In March 2020, a total of 150 NSS volunteers have planned and executed the Telangana Botanical Garden that resembles the shape of the geographical map of Telangana.

In July 2020, the Botanical Garden was enlightened and brought to the notice of Hon'ble Chief Minister of Telangana State and he has sanctioned an amount of **Rs. 50,000,00**/- (Rupees Fifty lakhs) for its development issuing the G.O vide number No.116 dated 21-07-2020.

5. EVIDENCE OF SUCCESS

Glimpse of Telangana Botanical Garden

So far, a total of 6400 saplings belonging to 527 species were planted in the garden. Of which, 15 threatened, 34 endemics, 78 ornamental, 32 fruit plants, 158 wild trees, 23 *Ficus* species, 20 Palms trees, 28 xerophytes, 25 wild ornamentals, 15 orchids conserving in garden. So far four students' projects works and one research article produced from the garden. So far many school children, college students from Jadcherla and nearby villages, Officials from various Departments and the trainees of Telangana Forest Academy, Hyderabad visited Telangana Botanical Garden as a part of their curriculum.

Not just limited to develop skills in the class rooms, this college has a social and Natural Biodiversity conservation obligation of protecting the populations of snake species in its locality by bringing awareness on "Snakes and their roll in Nature as predators". This Institution has efficient teams with staff and students of **Snake Rescue** headed by Dr. B. Sadasivaiah, Assistant Professor of Botany to prevent the killing of any kind of snake in the society by attending to place where a snake was observed by the people. The Snake Rescue team has good network in the society it helps to receive information about the appearance of snake. For this the teams have provided mobile phone numbers of the team members for receiving information about the snake appearance. People kill the snakes out of fear, knowing this the team immediately responds and catches the live snakes to liberate them in the safest habitat. For doing this environmental service the team received few awards from Biodiversity Conservation societies.

In this connection Dr. B. Sadasivaiah, Assistant Professor, Department of Botany, Dr. BRR Government Degree College, trains a few students at the college every year for conservation of snakes as well as to bring awareness on snakes. When people contact his phone number, which has been made public, these students and on occasion, the team rescue snakes for free in and around Jadcherla. They're released back into the forest after being collected. Students are able to participate in snake rescue and conservation. The location of the collection, the date of the collection, the time of the collection, and the name of the snake are all recorded in a logbook.

The Snake Rescue team has been conducting awareness programmes on "Snake conservation" in schools, colleges, and public places. The team showing live snakes and letting the audience hold them so they won't be scared when they see them. The team also demonstrates how to identify non-venomous and venomous snakes based on their distinguishing characteristics.

The above activities are the results of collaboration (MoU) work with District Forest Office, Mahabubnagar; Association for Biodiversity Conservation & Development (ABCD); National Service Scheme Unit-III of the college; Friends of Snake Society, Hyderabad and Department of Botany of this college.

The Department of Botany is also having collaboration with the local Government Hospitals and providing free consultation for identification of venomous snakes. The identification helps the Doctors to treat the patients.

As a results, from July 2018 to till date rescued 487 snakes from Jadcherla and surrounding villages by the Snake Rescue Team. A good number of awareness programmes on "Conservation of Snakes" were conducted by the team in nearby educational institutions. The log book of snake rescue, awareness programmes and Doctor Consultancy records were presented below.
